Located in the heart of downtown Springfield, Massachusetts, and set around a tree-lined quadrangle, the Springfield Museums offer access to five world-class museums, including the *D'Amour Museum of Fine Arts*, the *George Walter Vincent Smith Art Museum*, the *Springfield Science Museum* and the *Wood Museum of Springfield History*, the newly opened *Amazing World of Dr. Seuss Museum* and the *Dr. Seuss National Memorial Sculpture Garden*, a series of full-scale bronze sculptures of Dr. Seuss's whimsical creations, honoring the birthplace of Theodor Geisel, a.k.a. Dr. Seuss. For one admission price, visitors can enjoy all five Springfield Museums and the Dr. Seuss Park.

The museum is using a timed ticket procedure to stagger entry. Every hour 200 visitors are allowed into the Dr. Seuss Museum. Check the website for specific procedures.

The Lyman and Merrie Wood Museum of Springfield History is known for its local history research facilities and its huge and varied collections illuminating the history of the Connecticut River Valley. The Esta Manthos Indian Motocycle Collection includes the largest collection of Indian motocycles and memorabilia in the world. The Automobile Collection includes an 1899 Knox, a 1901 Crestmobile, a 1925 Rolls-Royce roadster, and a 1928 Rolls-Royce roadster. Other unique collections include Hasbro Gameland which tells the story of Milton Bradley, who launched the board game industry in America after moving to Springfield in 1856.
